Behavioral Achievement





Academic Highlight

Spotlight in 7th grade Science classes:

Mrs. Roy's and Dr. Gade's science classes have been filled with discussions and activities on living systems and chemical magic from our daily lives. By the end of the second unit, students were able to successfully complete project by answering the essential question "How does our body work?" through their collaborative presentations. In unit 3, Chemical Magic, students paired up to do hands on chemical reactions, gathered evidence to justify whether changes were physical or chemical changes.



Spotlight in Dr. Gade's Magnet 7 classes:

We are starting Design and Modeling (DM) in our 7th grade Magnet classes this semester. DM provides students opportunities to apply the design process to creatively solve problems. Students are introduced to the unit problem in the first activity and are asked to make connections to the problem throughout the lessons in the unit. Students learn and utilize methods for communicating design ideas through sketches, solid models, and mathematical models. Students work in teams to identify design requirements, research the topic, and engage stakeholders. Teams design a toy or game for a child with cerebral palsy, fabricate and test it, and make necessary modifications to optimize the design solution.



Spotlight from Ms. Madden's Class:

Ms. Madden gives a big shout to all her classes for adapting and following the classroom expectations. They have worked hard to adjust to the "new normal" of social distancing while reducing the amount of side conversations in the classroom. The change in behavior has enabled them to be actively engaged in instruction.

Spotlight from Ms. Rouco's and Ms. Gross's classes:

Ms. Rouco is very proud of her 7th graders for their hard work during the 2nd unit: ¡Vivir bien! / Living well! They learned vocabulary related to eating habits and physical activities. We had fun doing yoga poses, playing Kahoot, and Gimkit Team Challenges in our lessons. Good job guys! / ¡Buen trabajo chicos!
