



### When is an IEP an initial IEP?

1. Student is not currently eligible for special education programs and services.
2. Student moves in from out of state (with no previous Michigan eligibility)
3. Student is age 2.6 years of age or older and first evaluation for Part B.
4. Student was previously eligible for special education but later found ineligible.
5. Student was previously eligible for special education but parent revoked consent for services.

### When is an IEP **NOT** an initial?

1. Student moves in from other district in Michigan (30 day placement).
2. Student was previously Speech eligible and is now LD/CI/EI eligible.

### **REVIEW OF EXISTING EVALUATION DATA (REED) AND EVALUATION PLAN**



A REED must ALWAYS be completed in the EDPlan system.

The only exception to this is for student's age 3-5 years old not enrolled in school.

For data reporting purposes, we receive multiple errors that require correction when the REED is not completed in the system. Doing so will calculate your 30 school days for you (3-26 year olds). If you have paper copy REEDs, the information must be entered and finalized as a REED in EdPlan.

Contact your special education secretary to add you to the TEAM for a student you are considering for a special education evaluation. This process is simple as EdPlan stores information for all general education students in your school system.
