**NEW – HB71 – Baltimore County – Board of Education – Elected Members  
(Cross Filed with SB82)**

Establishing a procedure for the election of specified members of the Baltimore County Board of Education; requiring the elected members of the County Board to reside in and be elected from specified districts; establishing the term of office for the elected members and for their removal under specified circumstances; providing a procedure for filling a vacancy for an elected member; providing for the election of the chair and vice chair of the County Board; providing for the compensation of the members of the County Board; etc.

Recommended Board of Education position: Board Decision

**NEW – SB79 – Baltimore County – Board of Education – Membership**

Requiring the appointment of the members of the Baltimore County Board of Education made by the Governor to be with the advice and consent of the Senate of Maryland and requiring the composition of the membership of the Board to reflect the demographic composition of the student population in the county.

5 12 employees of the county appointed by the County Executive for a term coterminous  
6 with that of the Board as follows:

7 (1) Two from the staff of the County Board of Education;

8 (2) Two from the County Executive's administrative staff, one of whom  
9 shall be the Director of Central Services;

10 (3) One from the Department of Social Services;

11 (4) One from the Department of Recreation and Parks;

12 (5) One from the Department of Aging;

13 (6) One from the Health Department;

14 (7) One from the county community colleges, subject to the following  
15 conditions:

16 (i) Representation shall be determined on a rotating basis by  
17 alphabetical order by community college name; and

18 (ii) Each such member shall serve for 1 year;

19 (8) One from the Department of Juvenile Services;

20 (9) One from the county public libraries; and

21 (10) One from the Department of Planning.

22 (f) A county employee Council member who does not maintain his  
23 employment in the county shall be replaced.

24 (g) In addition to the county employee members, there shall be eight county  
25 citizens selected as members of the Council as follows and with the following duties:

26 (1) The county citizen members shall be selected by the County  
27 Executive. One member shall be selected from each legislative district of Baltimore

1 County with the approval of the State Senator from that district. Each legislative  
2 district representative shall reside in that district;

3 (2) The initial members selected to represent legislative districts 5, 7,  
4 9, and 11 shall each serve for a 2-year term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May  
5 31, 1981. Thereafter all members shall be selected to serve 2-year terms. The initial  
6 members selected to represent legislative districts 8, 10, 12, and 13 shall each serve  
7 for a 1-year term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May 31, 1980, and thereafter all  
8 members shall be selected for 2-year terms;

9 (3) A citizen member shall be entitled to attend and vote at a Council  
10 session where an issue before the Council concerns the school or schools in the citizen  
11 member's respective district; and

12 (4) When the Council meets to consider countywide issues, all selected  
13 citizen members shall be entitled to attend such sessions and vote.

14 (h) The Council shall:

15 (1) Meet as needed to compile the number of spaces in the public  
16 schools of the county that are not filled and to evaluate the feasibility of the utilization  
17 of the spaces by the community and county departments; and

13          [(g)] (I)    In addition to the county employee members, there shall be eight  
14 county citizens selected as members of the Council as follows and with the following  
15 duties:

16                   (1)    The county citizen members shall be selected by the County  
17 Executive. One member shall be selected from each legislative district of Baltimore  
18 County with the approval of the State Senator from that district. Each legislative  
19 district representative shall reside in that district;

20                   (2)    The initial members selected to represent legislative districts 5, 7,  
21 9, and 11 shall each serve for a 2-year term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May  
22 31, 1981. Thereafter all members shall be selected to serve 2-year terms. The initial  
23 members selected to represent legislative districts 8, 10, 12, and 13 shall each serve  
24 for a 1-year term beginning June 1, 1979, and ending May 31, 1980, and thereafter all  
25 members shall be selected for 2-year terms;

26                   (3)    A citizen member shall be entitled to attend and vote at a Council  
27 session where an issue before the Council concerns the school or schools in the citizen  
28 member's respective district; and



1                   (4)    When the Council meets to consider countywide issues, all selected  
2 citizen members shall be entitled to attend such sessions and vote.

3                   [(h)] (J)    The Council shall:

4                   (1)    Meet as needed to compile the number of spaces in the public  
5 schools of the county that are not filled and to evaluate the feasibility of the utilization  
6 of the spaces by the community and county departments; and

7                   (2)    Report its findings and recommendations to the County Board of  
8 Education and the County Executive at least twice during the school year.

9                   [(i)] (K)    The County Executive may, by executive order, appoint up to two  
10 additional members to the Council from agencies of the county government.

11                   SECTION 2. AND BE IT FURTHER ENACTED, That this Act shall take effect  
12 October 1, 2007.
