The recommendation for the purchase of vehicles is based on selecting the financing option that provides the most cost-effective financing plan. The proposed interest rate shall be fixed, and the principal and interest will be budgeted and paid each year, on an annual basis, in accordance with an established repayment schedule. The total principal and interest will be repaid over a period of six fiscal years (July 1 through June 30), but shall not exceed a period of 61 months. The financing arrangement has been coordinated with the Baltimore County Office of Budget and Finance to ensure that the annual payments required are funded in the BCPS budget. The proposal is conditioned upon the financing being a qualified tax-exempt obligation within the meaning of the Internal Revenue Code, which in turn requires the Board of Education to reasonably anticipate that it and its subordinate units would not issue tax-exempt obligations in the face amount of more than \$30 million during calendar year 2009. The award of the financing shall constitute evidence of such reasonable anticipation by the Board, as well as the Board's designation of the financing as a qualified tax-exempt obligation within the meaning of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The Board shall complete a delegate resolution to satisfy the official intent of the treasury regulations. Lindsey A. Rader, Esq., of Funk & Bolton, P.A., Baltimore, MD, shall serve as special tax counsel for this transaction.

Central Area Educational Advisory Council Meeting – 3/26/09

The meeting was held at Loch Raven Technical Academy. There were approximately 100 in attendance including: Laura Mullen, Chair, CAEAC; Donna Sibley, member, CAEAC; Linda P. Wilson, Principal, Loch Raven Academy; Bonnie Lambert, Principal, Loch Raven High School; Nancy Fink, Principal, Dumbarton Middle School; Susan Evans, Principal, Ridgely Middle School; Patricia Kaiser, Principal, Hampton Elementary; Dr. Jane Barranger, Principal, Towson High School; Kelly Erdman, Asst. Principal, Towson High School; Sonja Karwacki, Exec. Dir., Office of Special Programs K-12; and Jennifer Mullenax, Asst. to Central Area Asst. Superintendent.

Dr. Barranger introduced a group from Towson High School that included Ms. Erdman, Mary Elizabeth White, Social Studies Dept. Chair; Pat Brown, English Dept. Chair; and three History/Social Studies teachers. The group gave a presentation on the current curriculum at Towson High School (THS). The presentation hi-lighted the BCPS goals and missions and the research behind the decisions that were made in regard to the THS curriculum. THS uses what was referred to as AP Scaffolding – all levels of students getting the best instruction possible and getting the necessary skills to succeed. It was stressed that in order to do this, it is very important that the teachers have the proper skills. Many teachers, on their own – not required, seek out additional training in order to meet the needs of the students.

At THS, the Strategic Classroom Learning Model is used. That model consists of: High Expectations, Cooperative Learning, Collaborative Learning, Providing Extra Support, Differentiation, and Pause Lessons. Students are surveyed three times a year. Suggestions and requests from these surveys are incorporated in to future planning of lessons.

The presentation included some remarkable statistics on the programs and students at THS. All of these statistics were attributed to the following: Effective teachers that build relationships and have high expectations for all students; Effective lessons that actively engage and challenge all students; Staff development; Time to plan and to collaborate on lessons; and, Teacher training. Several times it was stressed that the curriculum that is being used at THS, and was presented tonight, works for the students of THS and might not work for other schools.

Karen Syrylo, Chair, Gifted and Talented Advisory Council, gave a brief over view of the events that had occurred over the past several months that precipitated the need for the topic of tonight's meeting. She also gave a brief over view of her meeting with Dr. Hairston on this subject.

Sonja Karwacki assured everyone that there will be no changes for the coming year. And, in the future, no changes will be made without parent input.

There was much discussion and many questions from the audience. Most questions were answered by the administrative staff members in attendance.

The meeting adjourned at 9:20 p.m.
