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Baltimore County Area Education Advisory Councils seek student members

Student leadership opportunity open to students in Grades 11 & 12

Towson, MD – Rising high school juniors and seniors are encouraged to apply to serve on the Area Education Advisory Councils of Baltimore County Public Schools.

The Board of Education of Baltimore County has education advisory councils in each of the school system's five geographic and administrative areas – southwest, northwest, central, northeast, and southeast. Board leaders explain that area education advisory councils exist to improve the quality of education in Baltimore County and to strengthen the relationship between the school system and the community by serving as informed advisors to the Board on public school issues and by promoting interest and involvement in the school system. Each council can have up to two students as members, and this year, all the councils are seeking additional student members.

“This is yet another great leadership opportunity for our students, an opportunity to lend their voices to strengthening our school system,” said BCPS Superintendent Dr. Darryl L. Williams. “Our goal is that these advisory councils should reflect the breadth of diversity that is Team BCPS.”
